### eLearning Assignment Due Dates

We will try an eLearning Day for the first time this year, and this will be our first trial of using a day for teacher professional development. We want this to be a positive experience for all involved. To this end, the window for students to begin working on assignments will open on Saturday, September 22nd and all assignments will be due on Monday, October 1st at 8:00 a.m. This window will provide students ample time to complete the material, and also allow teachers time to provide student and parent support, while at the same time monitoring and collecting the assignments as they are completed.

Please understand, as September 28th will count as an official day of school, if a student does not complete the work assigned in the time period provided, barring extenuating circumstances, the student will be marked as "absent - unexcused" and assignments will be counted as late and/or missing work.

### eLearning Assignment Links Accessed Through the School Website

Each grade level will have its own eLearning page. These pages can be found by clicking the eLearning tab on the left hand side of the School Website. Once there, you will need to click on your child's grade level to access his assignments and instructions for the day.

### eLearning Day Folders Coming Home for Students in Grades K-3

Students in K-3 will be receiving their eLearning folder next week. The folder will provide general materials (graphic organizers, paper, reference charts, etc.) and information for parents (directions, support contact information, etc.) for reference to help assist your children in working through eLearning Days.

### Below are details that may answer any further questions.

1. Assigned online lessons should take not more than 5 hours of your child's total time.
2. The lessons will be aligned to the curriculum and current material being covered in class.
3. Lessons will not require that anything be printed in order to complete them.
4. If you have a child with special needs, you will receive an email from a resource teacher with instructions specifically for your child.
5. We recognize unforeseen circumstances such as power outages may interrupt learning. We will consider these situations on an individual basis.

### SCHOOL PICTURE DAY - MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 17th

Monday, September 17, is our annual school picture day. On school picture day, students do not need to wear their uniforms. Students should dress nicely and modestly. NO jeans or denim shorts/capris, no sleeveless dresses or tops, no sandals or open shoes; see the handbook for more information about appropriate attire. Gym

classes and outdoor recess will still be held as scheduled, so parents/students should keep that in mind when choosing clothing. We hope to see many bright, shining faces and beautiful smiles on this day!!

Parents can put money into the student's account through your MealpayPlus online account at [www.mealpayplus.com](http://www.mealpayplus.com) or by calling 866-662-3382 for a small fee. Or, you may send a check with the Lunch Accounting Form below to the school cafeteria. For example, if you have 3 children, send a check for \$90 payable to St. Charles Cafeteria and designate \$30 to each child's account. Each child who will eat hot lunch needs to have money in their meal account. It is recommended to have a minimum of \$13.00 in this account which will pay for five meals. If the student may want additional portions of the main entree, then it is recommended to have a minimum of \$6.00 in the general account as well.
