21st Century Scholars Program

Your children may be eligible for college tuition through the 21st Century Scholars program. Students in the 7th or 8th grade who qualify for the program can receive up to four years of college tuition to attend an eligible Indiana public or private college or university. The scholarship may be reduced depending on the availability of the student's family to contribute to college. Income guidelines:

For each additional person in the household, add \$7,992

* The scholarship amount may be reduced depending on the availability of funds and the availability of the student's family to contribute to college. The only time you can apply for this program is when the student is in 7th or 8th grade. Students must be enrolled by June 30th of their eighth grade year!! ILEARN 2019- Students are required to have earbuds/headphones for testing.

ILEARN is Indiana's new online computer adaptive assessment designed to measure your child's proficiency of the Indiana Academic Standards in Grades 3–8, Biology and U.S. Government. ILEARN fulfills both state and federal legislative requirements as the accountability assessment for Indiana students.

The State of Indiana has designated Monday, April 22 through Friday, May 17 as the ILEARN testing window. St. Charles plans to begin the tests on Tuesday, April 23, for students in grades 3 through 8. If students are not absent, testing should be completed by Friday, May 3. Make-up tests will be given to students who have been absent, but these are not in the best testing environment, as testing space and test administrators are not as readily available. Please help the students to be in school and on time. All testing will be online this year. Gr. 3, 5-8 students will be using their Chromebooks and Gr. 4 students will be using their iPads. Students are required to have earbuds/headphones for testing.

NORTHEAST INDIANA REGIONAL SCIENCE FAIR

Congratulations to our six St. Charles students who advanced to the annual Northeast Indiana Regional Science and Engineering Fair at PFW. Many area schools participated last weekend. Our six students represented St. Charles well!

SCRIP NEWS

It's Here! – Next week St. Charles, Bishop Dwenger and FWCS will begin their spring breaks. Hopefully you have planned on gas cards and gift cards to your favorite fast food spots for your travels. If you are staying in Fort Wayne over the break, there are lots of things to do – shopping, movies, and bowling to name a few and SCRIP can be used for all those activities. The average rebate when using SCRIP is 5% and some restaurants offer a rebate as high as 15%. Remember ½ of the profit goes to the parish but the other ½ of the profit comes back to you!

Spring Break Schedule – With St. Charles beginning their spring break on Friday, March 29, this means SCRIP sales will take place on Thursday morning, *March 28*, and school orders will be collected and filled on Thursday instead of Friday. Parents can put money into the student's account through your MealpayPlus online account at www.mealpayplus.com or by calling 866-662-3382 for a small fee. Or, you may send a check with the Lunch Accounting Form below to the school cafeteria. For example, if you have 3 children, send a check for \$90 payable to St. Charles Cafeteria and designate \$30 to each child's account. Each child who will eat hot lunch needs to have money in their meal account. It is recommended to have a minimum of \$13.00 in this account which will pay for five meals. If the student may want additional portions of the main entree, then it is recommended to have a minimum of \$6.00 in the general account as well. If you have questions regarding this, you may call the school cafeteria at 969-4028 on school days 8:00-12:30 or the school office at 484-3392.
