IN THE WINGS

The Civic Theatre has an In The Wings Program whose goal is to enrich the educational experience of youth through the medium of the Theatre Arts. Since 1988, over 137,000 theatrical experiences have been provided to at-risk and economically disadvantaged youth and families. The core of the IN THE WINGS Program is to provide free tickets to children and their families for special IN THE WINGS performances of Civic Theatre productions. They believe that this exposure is, for many, an unfamiliar art form, which will spark creativity, produce lasting impressions, and reap many benefits. Tickets are given to qualifying schools and service organizations. Since the Civic's IN THE WINGS program is specifically to make free tickets available for at-risk and economically disadvantaged youth and families through schools and other agencies, first preference for the 40 tickets allowed St. Charles will be given to those families who qualify for free/reduced lunches. Children must be a minimum of 6 years old.

Talkbacks are always held after each IN THE WINGS performance for the audience to have a chance to chat with actors, crews, and directors and ask questions about the rehearsal process, set design and construction, costumes, and any other aspects of the productions. All are encouraged to stay and participate.

SCRIP NEWS

Merchant News – Good news - **Ruth Chris Steakhouse** opened in downtown Fort Wayne this past year! Even better news is that gift cards for this high end restaurant are available through our **SCRIP** program. They are available in **\$50** gift cards with a **10%** discount. Currently, they are a special order item. This means that you need to notify the **SCRIP** office no later **9 am** on Monday mornings and the cards will be available by noon on the following Thursday. They are also available as a **SCRIPNow** merchant.

SCRIP Now – Don't forget that you can buy SCRIP every day anywhere! How? With **SCRIP NOW!**

It's an on-line method of purchasing SCRIP in the form of e-certificates. E-certificates can be printed from your computer or download the **My Wallet** app. A special agreement form must be signed before you can begin to receive credit from this form of purchasing SCRIP. Do not share the St. Charles **SCRIP Now code** with others. It is important for the security of our program that we know each family that chooses to sign up and purchase **SCRIP** in this manner. We also remind you that you should never purchase physical cards through **SCRIP Now**, only the e-certificates and reloads. Physical cards put into a queue and are not released until we release them, which is not part of our inventory balancing procedure. So, ***please do not order physical cards on your own through SCRIP Now.***

Regarding Vision Referrals: Students are checked with the Snellen vision chart on Tuesday. Using those results, they are also given a vision screening by the eye doctors on Wednesday. Therefore, vision referral appointments and arranging appointments should be completed by the end of December. For example, if you have 3 children, send a check for \$90 payable to St. Charles Cafeteria and designate \$30 to each child's account. Each child who will eat hot lunch needs to have money in their meal account. It is recommended to have a minimum of \$13.00 in this account which will pay for five meals. If the student may want additional portions of the main entree, then it is recommended to have a minimum of \$6.00 in the general account as well.
