Kindergarten: pull-ups (2T/3T), pacifiers, cotton sleepers (any size)

Grade 1: pull-ups (4T/5T), sippy cups, fleece blanket sleepers (any size)

Grade 2: diapers (newborn), receiving blankets, onesies/shorts/pants (3-6 months)

Grade 3: diapers (size 1), onesies/shorts/pants (9-12 months), new/gently used books (0-2 years)

Grade 4: diapers (size 2), onesies/shorts/pants (18-24 months), new/gently used books (3-6 years)

News notes from your School Nurse

PLEASE READ AND SAVE

ATTENTION: Parents of current 5th grade students regarding 3 vaccinations.

The new Hepatitis A vaccine requirement for entrance to 6th grade starts this month!

HEPATITIS A -- is a series of two vaccinations given 6 months apart. You must start the first vaccination this month (JANUARY) in order to be able to complete the second dose prior to the

vaccination this month (JANUARY) in order to be able to **complete the second dose <u>prior</u> to the first day of school.**

Also, remember a <u>Tdap vaccination and a Meningitis vaccination are required</u> once your child turns 11 years old. HPV vaccine (human papilloma viris) is recommended to prevent a cancer but is not a requirement. (*Information regarding HPV is located on our school website.)

A form is due in the office from the doctor or provider that gave these three required vaccinations no later than the very first day of school in August. This is mandated by Indiana Code 20-34-4-2 and IC 4-22-2. It is best to make plans today and do not delay! This is a second notice

ATTENTION: Parents of students entering K-4 next year. This is just for your information.

The Hepatitis A Vaccination was extended to 4th graders for our next school year. (I believe everyone to be up-to-date. However, I will contact you if your child is missing any vaccinations or some were given too soon and need to be repeated.) Please, do not send in copies of immunizations unless contacted to do so.

Hepatitis A vaccine continues to be on a 'catch up' schedule. It will eventually be a requirement for all grade levels.

Next Sunday SCRIP sales will take place in the cafeteria after all the <u>morning Masses</u>. Come and enjoy coffee and donuts while checking out the ways you can make SCRIP work for you. Saturday evening sales will be in the SCRIP room in the Gathering Space as usual.

SCRIP Credit Statements – It's bonus time! That right, the statements for the rebates earned for the 2nd half of 2017 are ready. Some of the statements went home on Tuesday, most of them have been sent home with your St. Charles student today. Please check your child's backpack. If you know someone who doesn't have a student, you can tell them that their statement can be picked up at the SCRIP sales table. If you have a student and you did not receive your statement, contact the SCRIP office. Be sure to follow the instructions on how to redeem your rebate. Whether you are using it for tuition, lunch accounts or other school fees, it must be signed and the entire statement turned in to the SCRIP office; we will make sure it gets to the proper place.

If you plan to save it for use at a later time, it is **REALLY IMPORTANT** that you keep it in a safe place. Treat it like you would any check, cash or any other form of legal tender.

KROGER - Time to Re-enroll — Don't forget, if you have a **Kroger Plus Card**, you want to be sure to link it to St. Charles. If you have never done this, it's very easy. Simply go to the **Kroger Community Rewards** site and follow the steps to enroll. Our organization number is **10462**. If you have already enrolled, remember that you <u>must re-enroll every January</u>. Log into your account, go to **edit profile**, re-enter St. Charles organization number and click enroll. If you have questions, stop by the SCRIP table for details.
