Virtue of the Month for September - FAITH (The first of the Theological Virtues)

From the **Faith**, usually represented by an eye, is the theological virtue by which one is able to "see" God in the spiritual sense. Through this virtue comes a conviction that all God has revealed through Sacred Scripture and Tradition is true. If we look with the eyes of faith, things look different than they do in the natural realm. For example, if we see a child who is sick, we might only notice the suffering and be very sad. But with the eyes of faith, we see in the sick child an image of the suffering Christ.

DIGITAL CITIZENSHIP WEEK

Next week is Digital Citizenship Week in the state of Indiana! Digital Citizenship teaches students appropriate, responsible behavior with regard to technology use. A curriculum has been provided and we are using this as part of the students' computer class time. Our second through sixth graders have already started. Our kindergarten, first, seventh and eighth grade students will begin soon. Here is a brief overview of what is and will be covered in the coming weeks:

In grades K-2, the focus is on going places safely, ABC searching, keeping it private, my creative work and staying safe online.

In grades 3-6, the rings of responsibility, private and personal information, the power of words, the key to keywords and showing respect for other people's work are the lesson topics.

In grades 7 & 8, the focus will be on digital life 101, strategic searching, scams and schemes, cyberbullying and the rights of a creator.

Common Sense Media is the source for these lessons and is a wonderful resource for schools and parents alike. The students will be listening, sharing and engaging in activities to learn how to be responsible digital citizens. Look for further updates in future newsletters!

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FROM MRS. THROWER, SCHOOL NURSE

FYI: Recently, we have had a few families dealing with HEAD LICE.

Follow carefully all the information below if your family has been exposed.

Screen all family members routinely to identify signs of head lice as early as possible. Look for live lice, nits (eggs) attached to the hair shaft, open sores on the scalp, frequent head scratching, scalp irritability and sleeplessness.

Treat identified infested family members with a method recommended by your healthcare provider. Re-treat and comb out in 7-10 days as recommended

Remove nits from hair in a well lit area. Separate hair into sections and remove nits from the scalp to the ends of the hair with a nit comb or your fingers. Dip the comb in a glass of water between sections to remove nits from the comb, or dip your fingers into the water to deposit the nits.

Wash all recently worn clothes and bed linens in hot water (130) or if fabric is not colorfast, wash in recommended temperature then dry in the high heat dryer cycle for at least 20 minutes _____

Store all clothing, stuffed animals pillows/comforters, backpacks, etc. *that cannot be washed in hot water or dried in the high heat dryer cycle or vacuumed* in a plastic bag and seal for 2 weeks. _____

Clean combs and brushes by soaking for 5-10 minutes in hot water (130 F)

Vacuum all floors, carpets and furniture, particularly furniture/rooms recently used by the infested person.

Hard surface floors may also be mopped with hot water (130) if recommended by manufacturer.

Vacuum all cloth surfaces and carpet in vehicles used by the infested person.

Pay attention to recently used items such as headphones, athletic headgear, helmets, hats/scarves/caps, and hair accessories.

Report any new cases of head lice to the school, out-of-school care facility, and out-of-school activity contacts or groups to protect your family and community.

SCHOOL PICTURE DAY

Monday, September 19, is our annual school picture day. Students in grades K-7 are bringing home a flyer/order form/envelope today with information. Students in grades K-7 pre-order and prepay for their photos. Parents may do this online or with the form. Please read the information carefully when you receive it. There is one order per child. Every child in the family needs their own separate order and payment. Even if you do not wish to purchase pictures at this time, all students will be photographed to be included in the school yearbook. (There is a make-up day scheduled later for anyone who is ill and absent.)

Students in grade 8 will also have their portraits taken the same day, however, these students do not pre-order nor prepay. These students will receive proofs of several poses a few weeks later. From these proofs, students will place their orders and pay at that time.



On school picture day, students do not need to wear their uniforms. Students should dress nicely and modestly. NO jeans or denim shorts/capris, no sleeveless dresses or tops, no sandals or open shoes; see the handbook for more information about appropriate attire. Or, you may send a check with the Lunch Accounting Form below to the school cafeteria. For example, if you have 3 children, send a check for \$90 payable to St. Charles Cafeteria and designate \$30 to each child's account. Each child who will eat hot lunch needs to have money in their meal account. It is recommended to have a minimum of \$12.50 in this account which will pay for five meals. If the student may want additional portions of the main entree, then it is recommended to have a minimum of \$6.25 in the general account as well. if you have questions regarding this, you may call the school cafeteria at 969-4028 on school days 8:00-12:30 or the school office at 484-3392.
