Luke 10:38	St. Vincent Ferrer (1350-1419), a Dominican friar, loved the people to whom he preached. He was so concerned about the sincerity of their relationship with God that he was not afraid to tell them boldly about the evil of sin. Because they knew of his kindness and sincere interest in their souls, many heeded Fr. Vincent's warnings, converted, and lived holy lives. Once a man, at whose home Anthony was spending the night, came upon him and found him holding in his arms the Child Jesus, unspeakably beautiful and surrounded with heavenly light. John 1:47	St. Peter Claver (1581-1654) There was an active slave trade in Latin America when St. Peter Claver arrived there from Spain in 1610. Calling himself the "slave of slaves" Peter would meet each slave ship as it arrived so he could provide the slaves with food and medicine. He expressed his sincere love by trying to help each person with his immediate needs and then telling him or her about the love of Jesus. He strove to help all retain their human dignity. His sincerity melted the slaves' hearts, and many were converted to Christianity.	When we follow Jesus' example, we make sure that all of God's creations are cared for and have what they need.

Solar Eclipse in Four Months! In a little over 4 months there will be a total solar eclipse visible from a vast swath of the United States. On August 21st, the moon will block out the sun and the sky will go dark in the middle of the day. There hasn't been a total solar eclipse on the Continental US since 1979. Although Indiana is not on the Path of Totality (the 70 mile wide track of the umbra or darkshadow of the moon), the state will experience an excellent partial solar eclipse – between 83-99% of the sun will be blocked out by the moon, depending on location in the state. The highest level partial eclipse happens in the southwest tip of the state. In fact the far southwest tip on Indiana is only about 5 miles (as the crow flies) from the northern edge of the path of totality.
