Dear Parents and Students,

I hope you are well. We have had a great Catholic Schools Week celebration this past week - crazy hair, school spirit, dancing, prayer, food, science projects, a Redeemer Radio hour, and a bunch of other interesting, insightful, and just fun stuff! Thank you for choosing Catholic Schools, and thank you specifically for selecting our St. Charles Borromeo Catholic School. If you have good and faith-filled people - caring, supportive, involved - then you will have a good school. You are definitely good people, and we definitely have a successful school as a result. Please continue with your support and prayers as we feel your spiritual encouragement.

Good luck to our eight Cardinal basketball teams as they face tournament play over the next three weeks. Come out and support our Cardinal teams. There is nothing better than eating some popcorn and watching a basketball game in Indiana!

Now, after 110 days of the school year completed, how has the opening of Our Lady of Good Hope affected us? I will not say all that I would like to about the motivations behind, and the entire process of, the opening of Our Lady School. Mistakes were made, and I am confident that if another school is opened within the diocese that those mistakes will not happen again. Simply, Our Lady's opening has dented our enrollment, and we will feel this for a few years, but we will adjust and remain strong. We currently have 711 students enrolled, compared to 784 last year., Overall, counting kindergarten, we are missing 70 students who would have been enrolled in our school this year. Financially, at a conservative tuition-income value of \$3,000 per student, we lost roughly \$210,000 in income. However, after analysis, the actual total loss of tuition-income for this school year has been closer to \$330,000. As our costs could only be reduced minimally through a lesser quantity/cost of supplies, and as we could not justify reduction in force (teachers and staff) as our numbers were still too large to downsize from three classrooms to two classrooms, our costs remained fixed while our income decreased by that \$330,000. More regrettably, we lost human and spiritual capital; good families of faith and energy now contributing to another school's community. Of course, we still have great families of faith and energy sharing in our community of St. Charles, but we do miss those who have left.

Looking ahead, an additional consideration, is that we will now be competing annually for new students from the growing areas around our northeast boundaries. These are families from territories that our school has traditionally served faithfully for 59 years. We will continue to serve these families into the future, as we have a great deal to offer, and remain an attractive option for our Catholic families. Our school community is strong from top-to-bottom - faith life, curricular offerings, fine arts, athletics, before/aftercare program, enrichment and resource, a nice mix of newer and experienced teachers, vital support staff, an experienced administrative team, supportive parents, and bright and caring students. It is not a time to mourn our losses, nor rest on our laurels, but rather to plan aggressively and prayerfully for the future.

We will get smaller for a while, but I believe our Parish will begin a period of spiritual renewal and evangelization. In adjusting to lost students from OLGH, and in looking at past and present data, we will get smaller in grades K-8 for a while, and then grow again. When I arrived as principal in the fall of 2001, we were just ending a period of waiting lists for most grades K-8. A demographic study conducted in 1999 and updated in 2010, projected that our Parish was aging and would subsequently begin a period of declining membership over the next decade. The study has held true for the most part, as the number of aged has not been matched by the number of new, younger parishioners over the last 10-15 years. There are four main factors driving this decline:

- 1) Catholic families are having less children than in the past = a smaller pool of cradle Catholics from which to draw.

- 2) Most of the area within our immediate parish boundaries has been developed. Our parish and school reaped the benefits of larger housing developments in the 1980s through 1990s (Arlington expansion, Windymere, BuckingHam, Cherry Hill, Chandler's Landing, Wheelock & Rothman road developments, etc.). Around 2000, developments slowed in our area, and then the recession of 2008 halted most new development until this past year or two. In those growing times of the 80's and 90's families moved into those newer homes and raised families. Kids attended grade school, high school, and then went off to college. But the parents have stayed in those homes. Couples live in their homes for an average of 10-15 years after the kids are gone. So, generationally, the cycle has not played out in many of those neighborhoods. As homes turn over, younger families will move in, and the cycle will reset.
- 3) The overall school enrollment has been declining slowly, but steadily in the Diocese. The Choice Scholarship (voucher) provided a boost initially, but our data shows that diocesan enrollment overall has been flat-to-declining over the past three years. The financial help the Choice Scholarship has provided will help the high schools for years to come, as their tuition costs, even with financial aid, excluded some from moving from our grade schools into our high schools, but our grade schools are going to have to fight for every student. Now is not the time to pull inward, but to respond to the needs of our families and plan with an eye to the future.
- 4) Evangelization. As I mentioned earlier, I feel that our Parish is primed for a period of spiritual growth and renewal, which will result in an increase in parish and school membership. There has always been a very strong base of faith-filled and generous parishioners here at St. Charles and there still is. I invite all of you to talk to our priests and lay ministers and share your vision for this parish and school - programs, needs, concerns, joys, hopes, etc. - anything that would improve the parish and the school. Offer your talent, time, and treasure to help grow our faith-life here at St. Charles. I sincerely feel we are primed for renewal.

Historically, our St. Charles Borromeo School has been an outlier - an overachiever - for many years now. Traditionally schools as large as ours belong to parishes with proportionately large numbers of students enrolled in their Religious Education program - a few hundred to several hundred. Our Parish has had modest numbers, usually hovering around 100 students enrolled, in our Religious Ed classes annually. St. Vincent's, for example, has 460 students currently enrolled in their Religious Education program. That is a much larger pool from which to draw. We want to continue being overachievers, but again, we also want to re-energize and look for ways to improve, attract, grow, and maintain our faith formation, academics, and programs moving into tomorrow.

In closing, we need you! We need your positive minds and ideas. Your energy and your faith. Your common sense and your dreams. Also, invite others to check us out. Share your positive stories, your faith, and your kindness with them. Help them to see St. Charles in action. And thank you! Thank you for your children, prayers, and support. Our future is bright! Attention Parents of our future Kindergarten students:

Immunizations and 5 year physical examination requirements are very important and mandatory by state law to start school. The following is a list of immunization requirements.

5 DPT vaccinations

2 HEPATITIS A vaccinations

4 POLIO vaccinations

2 MMR vaccinations

3 HEPATITIS B vaccinations

2 CHICKEN POX vaccinations

These vaccinations are usually completed at the 5 year physical which is also required by state law. Look at your child's immunization records now to make sure there is plenty of time to catch-up if your child is behind schedule. Then, make the appropriate appointments promptly. **DO NOT WAIT FOR A SUMMER APPOINTMENT** unless there is a summer 5th birthday. Please send in this information as soon as it is completed. 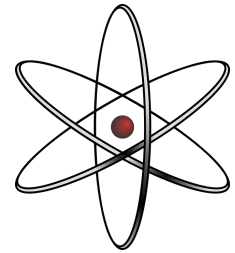

Thank you to our outstanding volunteers - *Carolyn Tyndall, Mary Jo Amorini and Tom Ryan* - who gave up so much of their Sunday to help us sell SCRIP after *all* the Sunday morning Masses. Thank you to everyone who placed an order, making for spectacular weekend sales. Thank you to Sam and Ashley Mathews, their family and their wonderful team of volunteers, which included the Knights of Columbus, for serving coffee and donuts to a tremendous number of parishioners. We sincerely appreciated so many "helpful hands."

It was the best of times; it was the worst of times - If you didn't know better, you might think that Mr. Dickens was describing our SCRIP program when he wrote those words.

We just experienced one of our *best* Decembers, topping last year's holiday sales by \$30,000. Yet our total sales for 2016 were down almost *\$76,000* over the total sales for 2015. The sales have decreased each year over the last 3 years; the percentage of parishioners who support the program on a regular basis has dropped from 21% to 16% and school family participation is at an all time low. Considering that we have more participating merchants than ever, that you have more opportunities to purchase SCRIP than many other programs and that the incentives to use SCRIP are greater than ever, one would have to conclude that last year might have been one of our *worst* years.

These facts aren't meant to chastise you but rather to challenge you. December sales proved that many of you are aware of SCRIP and we just enjoyed great sales during Catholic Schools week. Wouldn't you love to earn a rebate on *every* grocery and gas purchase, one that is usually greater than you can earn with your credit card? Isn't it exciting to know that half of that rebate supports your parish and that the other half is yours to use in many different ways including a rebate check?

Let's make the 2017 SCRIP sales top the 2016 sales and see if we can't see our program, once again, enjoy the best of times.
