HASA/BACK-TO-SCHOOL NIGHT, THURSDAY, AUGUST 17th, 7:00 PM IN CHURCH! ALL PARENTS SHOULD ATTEND!

Our HASA/Back-to-School Night will be held in the Church again this year. This is a night for parents. We ask that, if possible, the children not attend, as this is more of an informational format geared towards adults/parents. I realize that leaving the children at home may not be possible for some families, in which case, of course you are welcome to bring the little ones. At 7:00 p.m., all parents are asked to come to the Church where Father Shoemaker and I will welcome you. Our agenda will then move forward with school-related business. When the program is finished, all parents will go to their children's rooms. Junior high parents are invited to stay in the Church for a brief presentation from the junior high teachers.

As parents of students in grades K and grade 1 have already had a parent orientation night, they will not need to visit the classrooms. After the program in the Church, parents of grades 1 and K are welcome to check out the various groups who will set up displays in the cafeteria (Scouts, SCRIP, CardinalFest, Girls on the Run, etc.). All teachers, grades 2-8, will open their classrooms for parent visitation. We will have three (10 minute) sessions of visitation with a five-minute passing period between the three sessions.

Our resource teachers, and those who teach music, art, computers, physical education, and Spanish, will also be available for visits. Miss Svarczkopf, our librarian, will also be available in the library. The evening should be over by 8:45 p.m. Please realize you are all members of HASA, so we hope to see you there. STUDENTS - ARRIVE TO HOMEROOMS BY 7:50 a.m. EACH MORNING. Tardies Marked After 7:50am

To ensure that your child is in their classroom by 7:50 a.m. parents should be dropping off no later than 7:45 a.m. This is a parent responsibility as our students are not yet of driving age:) Please parents, do not cause stress for your children. Leave home in plenty of time to get to school. If you are currently cutting it close, I suggest beginning your entire morning routine 15 minutes earlier. The initial shock will soon become habit, and this will ensure that your children, and you, are not always in a stressful rush. Five tardy arrivals requires a student to serve an after-school detention. So please, be prepared, be calm, and be early!

BE A TEAM PLAYER - NO LEFT TURNS AFTER MORNING DROP OFF & AFTERNOON DISMISSAL

Doing so backs up traffic and creates some dangerous situations as people are gambling to pull out into heavy traffic. The cafeteria doors are open by 7:20 a.m., so you may want to drop off earlier to avoid the crush between 7:40-7:45 a.m. I thank everyone for your cooperation in dropping students off in the morning. As a drop off reminder, I do ask that students be prepared to get out of vehicles quickly when their turn comes to disembark. Parents, if students are having problems getting out of the car (upset, seat belt won't release, backpack problems, etc.) and the issue will take a while, please just pull into a parking spot so that you have the time you need and the line can keep flowing. SCRIP NEWS

Welcome to the New School Year! – On behalf of the SCRIP program, we welcome you to a new school year. We had the pleasure of meeting some of the kindergarten and first grade families on Tuesday evening. We look forward to welcoming the rest of you next Thursday, August 17, at the "Back-to-School" night.

What Is SCRIP? – If you are new to St. Charles or you just haven't taken time in the past to explore what SCRIP is, SCRIP is a parish fundraiser. We purchase gift cards at a discounted rate and sell them for face value; the difference is the profit. For example – Meijer currently gives us a 6% rebate, which means, if you purchase a \$100 Meijer gift card, you pay \$100 for it but it only cost us \$94. **The result is a \$6 profit.** Unlike most other fundraisers, YOU share in the profit! That \$6 is split 50/50 - \$3 for the parish and \$3 for you. If you were able to earn \$3/week on groceries for 52 weeks, you could put **\$106** back in your pocket! That's why we like to call it free money. Be sure to stop by the SCRIP table on Back-to-School night for more information.

Kindergarten and First Grade Families - Each of you should have received a packet of information about SCRIP along with the other information you received on Tuesday's Back-to-School night. There is a special order form attached to that packet. Return an order on **that specific** order form by **Friday, August 18**. Everyone who places an order on the special form by August 18 will be in a drawing for a **\$25 SCRIP Gift Certificate**.

Merchant News – Meijer's normal rebate is 4%, however, from time to time, merchants offer a bonus and increase their rebate. Meijer is currently at 6%!

Walgreens is temporarily unavailable from our supplier, Great Lakes. We have a few \$100 in stock but are out of \$25 cards. We apologize for this inconvenience.

"Many hands make light work" – That's what my mother used to say and I have found it to be true. It takes a lot of volunteers to successfully run our SCRIP program. From helping at sales to delivering orders to the classrooms, there are many jobs requiring anywhere from 30 minutes to a 2-hour time commitment.
