Thank you to our parent volunteer drivers, teachers, Sr. Genevieve, Mr. Hoersten, our maintenance and cafeteria crews who adapted routines to provide a late lunch for students, and our recess monitors who stayed an hour over to supervise the late recess time. All-in-all, a very nice day!

Fall Sports RoundUp! First, allow me to thank all of our coaches, athletic officers, students, and parents for working together to create a competitive, honorable, and well-rounded athletic program. There is a great deal of time involved on everyone's part, and I am proud of all that you do in representing our St. Charles Borromeo School. Keep up the good work! Let's recap the fall season.

- The Cardeagles, our boys and girls Cross Country team, had another successful season! They concluded the year running in the Cardeagle Invitational, where the boys finished 3rd and the girls finished 2nd overall against some stiff competition. Well Done!
- Our Varsity Cheer squad competed recently in three competitions, finally breaking through at the Bishop Dwenger Invitational with a 1st in Class, and a Grand Champion designation across all divisions. Gimme a G-R-E-A-T J-O-B!
- The 5th & 6th grade volleyball teams made strong runs this year, both just coming up short in their CYO tournaments. While our 7th and our 8th grade Volleyball teams both finished as Runners-up in hard-fought Championship matches. Way to go Ladies!
- Finally, our Varsity boys football team completed a strong season, losing a tough Championship game that came down to the final seconds. And their junior counterparts the boys 5th & 6th grade teams both brought home Championships to conclude their seasons.

A Word about Manners & Self-Control, Student Effort, Grades, and Academic and/or Behavioral Probation. As the first quarter of school has come to a close, I wanted to share that we have been stressing 'manners' and 'self-control with our students over the past few weeks. We are especially focused on framing requests using "May I please" or "Could I _____, please" along with acknowledging the people around us with "Thank you" or "Thanks". Additionally, showing self-control by keeping voices down, hands to self, walking in straight lines, and just showing, through words, tone, body language, and actions that expectations are understood, and that the good people and efforts around us are acknowledged and appreciated. We are continually working at building a community that Jesus would be proud of if he were sitting next to us, and understanding that He is actually sitting with us!

Also, it is important that I remind parents and students that consistent lack of positive effort either academically and/or behaviorally may be grounds for student probation and or withdrawal as necessary. All students are blessed with different abilities, gifts, and challenges. And, some students will struggle with academics and behavior. We have had students who, despite great effort to control outbursts, or achieve decent marks, would struggle mightily to even pass classes or control impulses. The caveat was that those students worked very hard all the time. They might fail at times along the way, but their effort was mighty. On the flip side, we sometimes have students who simply will not give effort. They could behave or they would have decent grades, but they lack the discipline or will to put forth strong, or even modest, effort. For those students, behavioral and/or academic probation will be necessary moving forward. If progress is not made by the end of second quarter, they may be asked to withdraw from St. Charles.

eLearning Assignment Due Dates

We will hold an eLearning Day for the first time this year, as we will use this first day as an eLearning day for teacher professional development. We want this to be a positive experience for all involved. To this end, the window for students to begin working on assignments will open on Friday, November 8th and all assignments will be due on Monday, November 18th at 8:00 a.m. This window will provide students ample time to complete the material, and also allow teachers time to provide student and parent support, while at the same time monitoring and collecting the assignments as they are completed.

Please understand, as November 15th will count as an official day of school, if a student does not complete the work assigned in the time period provided, the student will be marked as "absent - unexcused" and assignments will be counted as late and/or missing work.

eLearning Day Folders Coming Home for Students in Grades K-3

Students in K-3 will be receiving their eLearning folder next week. The folder will provide general materials (graphic organizers, paper, reference charts, etc.) and information for parents (directions, support contact information, etc.) for reference to help assist your children in working through eLearning Days.

Below are details that may answer any further questions.

1. Assigned online lessons should take not more than 5 hours of your child's total time.
2. The lessons will be aligned to the curriculum and current material being covered in class.
3. Lessons will not require that anything be printed in order to complete them.
4. If you have a child with special needs, you will receive an email from a resource teacher with instructions specifically for your child.
5. We recognize unforeseen circumstances such as power outages may interrupt learning. We will consider these situations on an individual basis.

21st Century Scholars Program

Your children may be eligible for college tuition through the 21st Century Scholars program. Students in the 7th or 8th grade who qualify for the program can receive up to four years of college tuition to attend an eligible Indiana public or private college or university. The scholarship may be reduced depending on the availability of the student's family to contribute to college. Income guidelines:

<u>Household Size</u>	<u>Maximum Annual Income</u>
2	\$31,284
3	\$39,461
4	\$47,638
5	\$55,815
6	\$63,992

For each additional person in the household, add \$8,177

* The scholarship amount may be reduced depending on the availability of funds and the availability of the student's family to contribute to college.

The only time you can apply for this program is when the student is in 7th or 8th grade. Students must be enrolled by June 30th of their eighth grade year!!
