Coronavirus Recap of Cancellations and Postponements

- 1. The Father-Daughter Dance has been canceled for tonight refunds will be forthcoming over the course of next week. This may or may not be rescheduled at this time.
- 2. The Spring Play has been postponed. Performance date TBD.
- 3. The Knights of Columbus Fish Fry will still be held next Friday Carry out only at this time.
- 4. ISSMA and FAME have been canceled.
- 5. Afterschool activities with students will still go on as long as school is in session (play practice, children's choir, athletic practices, etc.). Once school is out, no school activities.
- 6. Larger gatherings will most likely be canceled in the coming weeks.
- 7. The school is still planning, in the event of a two-week closure, to provide at least three days of eLearning for the first 10 days out. In the event of all schools closing, the State IDOE is waiving up to 20 days, but we will have no idea if the days might reach beyond this time frame. We want to keep students' minds at least a little active, and begin to hedge our bets while keeping stress on the families and students to a minimum. I have already spoken to the 6-8 grade students and communicated this information this morning. I asked for them to step up and lead, being as well-behaved, cooperative, and acting as role models for the younger students. I also asked them to step it up at home in case they are needed to help take care of younger siblings. I thank them for having done so.
- 8. Pueri Cantores has now been officially canceled. All monies will be refunded.
- 9. The 6th grade trip to the Synagogue has been postponed.
- 10. The 8th grade trip to Indianapolis has been postponed.
- 11. The 4th grade visit to Turnstone has been postponed.
- 12. Until further notice, the distribution of homemade treats (birthday, VIP, student of the week) will be suspended. Hopefully, students will have the opportunity in the future.
- 13. Until further notice, no live pets will be permitted to be brought into the building.
- 14. Weekend mass

Indiana Severe Weather Preparedness Week—March 15-21, 2020

The National Weather Service (NWS), in conjunction with the Indiana State Police and Public Safety Commission, Indiana Department of Homeland Security, Department of Education, the Indiana Broadcaster's Association, the Red Cross, and Amateur Radio Operators will conduct a statewide test of communication systems on Wednesday, March 18 at 10:15 A.M. EDT. If weather postpones the tests, a make-up test is Thursday, March 19 at the same time listed.

The goal of Severe Weather Preparedness Week is to build towards a Weather Ready Nation where Hoosiers are prepared for and respond to all dangerous weather and flood hazards.

This packet contains information about severe weather terms, safety rules, and some tornado events that affected Indiana. Daily statements will be issued on newswires and NOAA All Hazards Radio during the week. Your local National Weather Service office and our partners are available for interviews.

As part of NWS efforts to build a Weather Ready Nation, the goal of Severe Weather Preparedness Week is to better educate people about the hazards of severe thunderstorms and tornadoes, and to help everyone be prepared when severe weather occurs. Each day will focus on a different topic:

- **Sunday:** *Kick-Off:* Discuss partners' roles in severe weather
- Monday: Severe Weather Outlooks and Watches: Partners' roles at the outlook and watch stages of an event
- Tuesday: Warnings: Taking action when warnings are issued
- **Wednesday:** *Response:* Partners' roles in responding to disasters (real-time response)
- Thursday: Recovery: Partners' roles in the recovery process (days/weeks/months after disaster)
- **Friday:** Weather Ready Nation: How we are working to build a Weather Ready Nation
- Saturday: Wrap-Up: Importance of preparedness and action during threatening hazards

What should you do at each step as severe weather threatens - outlook (hours to days in advance), watch (minutes to hours in advance), warning (event is threatening now)? Think READY (outlook), SET (watch), GO (warning)!

To help you be ready, find out how to get <u>one tap access to the National Weather Service on your smartphone!</u>
This week, we also remind Hoosiers to be aware of the underappreciated but deadly dangers of flooding. Click the "Turn Around, Don't Drown!" barriers below to learn more. Click the flood safety image to see a Turn Around, Don't Drown PSA on YouTube.

Our partners at the American Red Cross have released a "flood app" for smartphone and tablet users. It provides location-based flood and flash flood watches and warnings from the National Weather Service, as well as the ability to quickly send an "I'm Safe" message to the Red Cross in case loved ones are unable to contact you. Additionally, the application provides access to lifesaving tips on actions to take, shelter locations, and more.
