Dear Parents and Students,

Today's Gospel, Wednesday, reminds us of the importance of thankfulness, as Jesus cleanses the ten lepers. **Luke 17:11-19:** *Now on the way to Jerusalem he traveled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered one of the villages, ten lepers came to meet him. They stood some way off and called to him, 'Jesus! Master! Take pity on us.' When he saw them he said, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' Now as they were going away they were cleansed. Finding himself cured, one of them turned back praising God at the top of his voice and threw himself at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. The man was a Samaritan. This made Jesus say, 'Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they? It seems that no one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.' And he said to the man, 'Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved you.'*

I'm sure that most of us, upon reading this, feel that we would have definitely returned to say 'Thank You' to Jesus. The reality is, we probably do not thank Jesus enough for all that we have. We take many things for granted, forgetting that all that we have is a blessing from God. With this in mind, I want to share that I am very thankful to God for all of you.

Out-of-Uniform Reminder - No leggings, no joggers, no sweatpants, no warm-up pants, no patched, ripped, or torn jeans. I feel like I am writing a Dr. Seuss verse. Ok, as we do every year, we would like to continue to have out-of-uniform/dress down days sprinkled throughout the school year. Both students and staff look forward to these days just to change things up a bit and feel more comfortable. We only ask that students follow the dress down guidelines. We have consistently told students, among other no-no's, not to wear leggings as pants to school on dress down days. We seem to have the same young people pushing the rules each time. Repeated issues will result in those who will not follow the rules, not being allowed to dress down. Be neat, clean, modest and follow the rules and we will enjoy the upcoming days out of uniform. "Dress Down - Clothing worn on these days is of a more casual nature. It must be neat and not torn. When wearing shorts, please wear shorts with pockets such as a jean shorts. Shorts must be no shorter than four inches above the knee. These items are not acceptable: Ripped/torn clothing, **leggings worn as pants**, warm-up/jogging suits, gym trunks, athletic shorts, cut off shorts, sweatpants, wind suit pants, swishy pants, clogs, sandals, or shirts with inappropriate pictures or messages, and shirts which do not cover the stomach and waist. Tank tops or sleeveless tops are not permitted."

SCRIP NEWS

It's Back! – Believe it or not, we are already having the kind of weather that can impact our school schedule. What does that mean for **SCRIP**? If school calls for a 2 hour delay, **SCRIP** follows the delay. On Mondays, we still collect the orders the students bring in, fill them and return them to school before dismissal time. On a Friday, if there is a 2 hour delay, the Friday morning sales are delayed as well – they take place in the Hession Center from 10-11 AM and school orders are collected and filled as well. If school is cancelled on a Monday, **SCRIP** will move our Monday tasks to Tuesday. If school is cancelled on Friday, **SCRIP** sales are cancelled. Stay warm and safe.

Merit Scholarship Exam

(For current 8th Grade Students)

Saturday, December 7, 2019 – 8:45 am

(Doors open at 8:30am. Enter through Door #1 by the blue pillars!)

Bishop Dwenger High School will administer the Merit Scholarship Exam to any 8th grade student interested in competing for an academic scholarship to be applied toward Bishop Dwenger tuition. Typically, 4-8 scholarships are awarded each year, determined solely on merit. **Registration deadline is Friday, November 22, 2019.** The registration cost is **\$25.00**, which is non-refundable. **NO REGISTRATION IS ACCEPTED AFTER THIS DATE. NO EXCEPTIONS!** There will be a limited number of seats available at the door the morning of the test for \$30.00, beginning at 8:30am. (First come, first serve; seating is limited.) There is no alternative date for this exam.

Students are asked to bring 2 sharpened #2 pencils (not mechanical). The test will cover Verbal, Quantitative, Reading, Language and Math. Students may go to www.ststesting.com/hspt to learn more about the test. This scholarship money is awarded solely on merit.

Students are to arrive by 8:45 am with testing beginning by 9:00 am. The testing will end around 11:45 am. Students should be picked up by 12:00 pm. Or, you may send a check with the Lunch Accounting Form below to the school cafeteria. For example, if you have 3 children, send a check for \$90 payable to St. Charles Cafeteria and designate \$30 to each child's account. Each child who will eat hot lunch needs to have money in their meal account. It is recommended to have a minimum of \$14.00 in this account which will pay for five meals. If the student may want additional portions of the main entree, then it is recommended to have a minimum of \$6.00 in the account as well.
