Pre-Kindergarten 4-Year-Old Enrollment Tuesday, February 6th, 1:15-2:30 p.m. or 6-7 p.m. in the Art Room

I wish to invite you to our Pre-Kindergarten registration day on Tuesday, February 6th, in the afternoon from 1:15-2:30 p.m. in Rooms C & D of the Hession Center, or you may attend the evening session from 6:00-7:00 p.m. in the Art Room. All parents are asked to park in the rear of the school and enter through door # 3.

As a school, we are committed to establishing a Pre-K 4-year-old program for the upcoming school year, and we would like to at least get our foot in the door pending future program expansions (PK 3-year-old), and building renovations and/or new construction. For this coming school year 2018-2019, we will be offering a section of five-day Pre-Kindergarten classes for 4-year-old students. This will be a half-day program. We will open one classroom of 15-18 morning students, and follow with an afternoon section of the same. Each class will be lead by a certified lead teacher and the assistance of an instructional aide each day.

Our morning program will run from 7:50 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. and our afternoon program will run from 11:50 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. If you have need, for an additional fee, we will offer our Beforecare service to those students in the morning Pre-K 4 program & our Aftercare service to those students in the afternoon Pre-K 4 program.

We do understand that some of our families desire a full-day Pre-K program. If, after the initial registration period (Feb. 6th - Feb. 16th), we have open spots in either session, we will allow those parents who desire it, to enroll in both the morning and afternoon sessions. We will communicate this availability on February 17th.

Initial tuition costs are projected to be \$1,700 (\$142 per month over 12 months) per half-day program plus a one-time \$40 registration fee. Our February registration for our Pre-K 4 Program is early enough to ensure that parish families of St. Charles Borromeo have a first opportunity to register their children for pre-kindergarten. Please bring to registration:

1. A copy of your child's Social Security card, birth certificate and baptismal certificate.
2. We will also need a copy of your child's immunization record.
3. The registration fee is \$40.00 and is nonrefundable.

We want to ensure your child's school experience is a faith-filled, engaging, and supportive experience. I thank you for your time, and I look forward to seeing you at registration. If there are any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to call me.

Kindergarten Registration is now open! We have over 1,000 students signed up so far!

Ahhh no. However, we have had a nice response so far. Please contact the office ASAP if you would like to register for Kindergarten for next school year. Tell a friend or neighbor. The Flu season is here! We have some flu in the school, but overall are OK. Trying to figure out if your child has the flu or just a cold or something else can be confusing and worrisome. Here are some tips from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention

You may have the flu if you have some or all of these symptoms:

Fever*	Cough	Sore throat	Runny/stuffy nose	Body aches	Headache
* you can have flu w/out a fever	Chills	Fatigue	Sometimes diarrhea & vomiting	Rash	

What should I do if I get sick?

Most people with the flu have mild illness and do not need medical care or antiviral drugs. If you get sick with flu symptoms, in most cases, you should stay home and avoid contact with other people except to get medical care.

If, however, you have symptoms of flu and are in a high risk group, or are very sick or worried about your illness, contact your health-care provider (doctor, physician assistant, etc.).

High Risk Groups

Certain people are at high risk of serious flu-related complications (including **young children**, people 65 and older, pregnant women and people with certain medical conditions). This is true both for seasonal flu and novel flu virus infections. (For a full list of people at high risk of flu-related complications, see People at High Risk of Developing Flu-Related Complications). If you are in a high risk group and develop flu symptoms, it's best for you to contact your doctor early in your illness. Remind them about your high risk status for flu. CDC recommends that people at high risk for complications should get antiviral treatment as early as possible, because benefit is greatest if treatment is started within 2 days after illness onset.

Do I need to go the emergency room if I am only a little sick?

No. The emergency room should be used for people who are very sick. You should not go to the emergency room if only mildly ill.

What are the emergency warning signs of flu sickness?

If you have the emergency warning signs of flu sickness, you should go to the emergency room. If you get sick with flu symptoms and are at high risk of flu complications or you are concerned about your illness, call your health care provider for advice. If you go to the emergency room and you are not sick with the flu, you may catch it from people who do have it.

Emergency Room Warning Signs In children

- Fast breathing or trouble breathing
- Bluish skin color
- Not drinking enough fluids
- Not waking up or not interacting
- Being so irritable that the child does not want to be held
- Flu-like symptoms improve but then return with fever and worse cough
- Fever with a rash

In addition to the signs above, get medical help right away for any infant who has any of these signs:

- Being unable to eat
- Has trouble breathing
- Has no tears when crying
- Significantly fewer wet diapers than normal

Emergency Room Warning Signs In adults

- Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath
- Pain or pressure in the chest or abdomen
- Sudden dizziness
- Confusion
- Severe or persistent vomiting
- Flu-like symptoms that improve but then return with fever and worse cough

Are there medicines to treat the flu?

Yes. There are drugs your doctor may prescribe for treating the flu called "antivirals." These drugs can make you better faster and may also prevent serious complications. See Treatment – Antiviral Drugs for more information.

How long should I stay home if I'm sick?

CDC recommends that you stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone except to get medical care or other necessities. Your fever should be gone without the use of a fever-reducing medicine, such as Tylenol®. You should stay home from work, school, travel, shopping, social events, and public gatherings.

What should I do while I'm sick?

Stay away from others as much as possible to keep from infecting them. If you must leave home, for example to get medical care, wear a facemask if you have one, or cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue. Wash your hands often to keep from spreading flu to others.

ABCS OF BULLYING PREVENTION



Known worldwide as the "Ambassadors of Goodwill"™, the iconic Harlem Globetrotters present the community outreach program, "The ABCs of Bullying Prevention," in an effort to impact schools and communities around the world. Designed by the Globetrotters in coordination with the National Campaign to Stop Violence (NCSV), the program focuses on Action, Bravery, and Compassion, comprising the ABCs.

The program targets 6-12 year-old kids and involves Globetrotter players discussing the three key words in the ABCs and tools that kids can use on a daily basis to reduce bullying. The Globetrotters equate what it means to be part of a team to how kids can offer support to one another to help stop bullying.

Buckets Blakes was born and raised in Phoenix and still lives in the Valley of the Sun, and his first exposure to basketball was watching the Phoenix Suns at the age of five. To make his own hoop, he would cut a hole in the top of his dad's hat, flip it over and shoot a tennis ball through it. Years of practice from that point forward made him one of the most accurate shooters around (hence the name "Buckets"). He can fill it up in many different ways, like when he broke the Guinness World Records® record for the most basketball underhanded half-court shots in one minute, dropping six – one more than the previous record. He actually made those six shots in just 46 seconds.

On the Globetrotters' very first World Trick Shot Day (Dec. 6, 2016), Buckets nailed the highest shot ever recorded in North America. From the top of the Tower of the Americas in San Antonio, Buckets made a 583-foot basketball shot to a hoop located below.

His parents are his heroes, because they always involved Buckets and his nine siblings in positive things. He made them proud by earning his bachelor's degree in psychology in January of 2012 by taking online courses. Despite the demands of entertaining people all over the world year-round, Buckets made the Dean's List three times while completing his courses.

One of his favorite childhood basketball memories was when he finally stole the basketball from his older cousin, who taught him how to dribble. "He was one of the best basketball players in the state, and he would never just give me the ball; I had to try and steal it every time," explains Buckets. "When I finally stole it from him, my confidence soared, and my fate in the game of basketball was sealed."

Buckets was not only an outstanding basketball player growing up, but he also lettered in track and football in high school. As his basketball talents grew, his high school coach, Michael Ellsworth, showed him that hard work pays off, both on and off the court. He took that work ethic to Arizona Western College, and then to the University of Wyoming, where he was team captain and MVP his junior and senior seasons, leading the team in rebounding, assists and steals as a junior. As a senior, Buckets was one of only two Mountain West Conference players to finish in the top 15 in scoring, rebounding and assists.

Buckets enjoys working with and mentoring kids, so he relishes the opportunities he's had to present the Globetrotters' various community outreach programs all over the world as an Ambassador of Goodwill™. During the fall of 2017, Buckets had the unique opportunity to travel to Lithuania and Estonia as part of the U.S. State Department's Sports Envoy program, where he and his teammate, Ace Jackson, presented the team's renowned anti-bullying program and conducted basketball clinics to thousands of kids. He sees himself running his own gym someday and helping kids build character and self-esteem through sports mentoring. He encourages youngsters to, "Be the best 'you' that you can be, because it's very difficult to try and be someone else."

ISTEP/IREAD - The State of Indiana has designated Monday, February 26 through Friday, March 9 as the ISTEP Part 1 testing window. St. Charles plans to begin the tests on Monday, February 26, for students in grades 3 through 8. If students are not absent, testing should be completed by Wednesday, February 28. Make-up tests will be given to students who have been absent, but these are not in the best testing environment, as testing space and test administrators are not as readily available. Please help the students to be in school and on time.

ISTEP part 2 testing window will be April 16 through May 4 for all students in grades 3 through 8 and will be online. Again, we ask that no appointments be scheduled for this time, ensuring that the students will not be absent during testing.

All testing will be online this year. Students will be using their Chromebooks (grades 6-8), Gr. 4 iPads (grades 4 & 5) or our school desktop and laptop computers (grade 3). You can check out the ISTEP online experience here:

And lick all the crumbs off the floor!


