## **An open letter to our 8th grade students, the St. Charles Borromeo School Graduating Class of 2017 from Mr. Sordelet**

Hanging in the hallway outside of the school office are a series of twenty photos of the entire school assembled in front of the school. We usually take this annual picture within the first three weeks of school following an all-school Friday Mass. We range all of the students in grade order with kindergarten in the front, followed by first grade and so on with teachers and staff interspersed along the edges. Students and new families often stop to look at the pictures, mostly to try to find themselves, a tiny face among the crowd of 800+ people. I went looking for this year's class of 2017. They made their first appearance in the 2009-2010 picture as first grade students freshly graduated in May of the previous year from our kindergarten then located at Our Lady of Good Hope. So in this, their first all-school group photo, our graduates were in the third and fourth rows as our kindergarteners, onsite for the first year of our new kindergarten wing, dominated the first two rows of the photo. So, in summary, this class missed its big chance at the front row of the picture. They did not have a chance at full body, front row shots, but instead were reduced to floating heads for eight years in row.

But, I found them anyway. And those floating heads moved back a row or four each year and grew a little longer, and wider, and now this year's fashion, a bit hairier! It is amazing, even after eight years of photos, that you can still match the young faces with the current faces. You just have to look long and deeply.

As your Principal, the long view, is a privilege of the position. You now are maturing in looks into young ladies and gentlemen, and I have had the privilege of seeing you grow, for most, over a nine or seven or five-year period. I do not mean just in the physical sense, which is important, but the growth in personality, understanding, wisdom, joy, and spiritual depth. And I am very proud of who you have become. You, the Class of 2017, have been a very interesting and strong class. Whether on the playing fields, or on the stage, or performing musically, or in student leadership, or participating at Mass, or leading the Rosary, you have always performed admirably. Not bubbly, but reasoned and dependable when it counted. I have enjoyed being with you over the years. I thank you for all that you have contributed to our school community. Stay close to God and remember your roots. Your futures are very bright, and whatever and wherever God takes you in life, my prayer for you is that God will hold you, always, in the palm of His hand! -Rob S.

Current students in kindergarten through grade 7 may check out books. Students going into grades 2 through 8 will also be able to take Accelerated Reader tests. Students who take tests this summer will be a step ahead when school starts in August. For second grade through eighth grade, AR points count as part of the reading grade. The points earned over the summer count for the first quarter of 2017 school year. Plus, if your child takes a test over summer, they will be eligible to win gift cards! The more tests students take, the more likely they are to win.

Students may read any AR books from home, any branch of the Allen County Library, or our school library. To see if a particular book has an AR test go to: [www.arbookfind.com](http://www.arbookfind.com). After typing in the name of a book, you will be able to see the reading level and number of AR points for that book, along with a summary and much more. The only place students may take tests is at the St. Charles Library. Tests are available on school computers only.

## NEWS NOTES FROM YOUR SCHOOL NURSE

**Attention parents:** Please mark your calendars and notice the included flyer from Indiana MOM (Mission of Mercy). **A FREE Dental event will be held Friday and Saturday, May 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>, at the Indiana State Fairgrounds in Indianapolis.** The goal of this event is to provide charitable dental services to underserved Hoosiers, both adults and children including: -Comprehensive oral exams, X-Rays, Cleanings, Extractions, Fillings, Limited crowns, limited root canals, limited partial dentures. Get that needed dental work completed for you and the children.

All services are free, no insurance is necessary, and no questions will be asked of patients. Go early. For more information: <https://IndianaMOM.org>.

**VISION REFERRALS:** The State of Indiana requires that we do a yearly vision and hearing screening on appropriate grade levels. This was done in early October. Failure and borderline failure referral letters were sent out promptly. Where are your vision referral forms? Contact me in the office if you may have misplaced your child's vision referral form or write a note that an eye exam was completed and the results of it. Many forms are outstanding. Our state report is due very soon.

**IMMUNIZATIONS:** Kindly send in your child's immunization dates. Do not wait until the last minute and cause yourself stress. Make kindergarten physical appointments now, and have immunizations completed in the doctor's office, at a clinic, or SuperShots.

Remember to bring your child's vaccination record to that appointment. Then, have this information sent to school now. It is due, by Indiana state law, on the first day of school.

Those needing immunizations were noted in detail in a previous newsletter.

Here is a quick recap:

**Current 5<sup>th</sup> graders need:** Tdap and Meningitis vaccines. Hepatitis A is recommended.

**Next year's K-3** need 2 Hepatitis A, 2 MMR, 5 Dtap, 4 Polio, 2 Varicella, 3 Hep B.

**All other grades:** Hepatitis A is recommended at this time but it will eventually be a requirement.

**Medications:** All medications not picked up by the last day of school will be destroyed. Please pick up your meds last week of school. (Epi-Pens may not be picked-up until the last day of school for obvious reasons.) We **cannot** store ANY Medications or Epi-Pens over the summer break. Please remember to pick up your meds.
