HASA/BACK-TO-SCHOOL NIGHT, WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 17th, 7:00 PM IN CHURCH! ALL PARENTS SHOULD ATTEND!

Our HASA/Back-to-School Night will be held in the Church again this year. This is a night for parents. We ask that, if possible, the children not attend, as this is more of an informational format geared towards adults/parents. I realize that leaving the children at home may not be possible for some families, in which case, of course you are welcome to bring the little ones. At 7:00 p.m., all parents are asked to come to the Church where Father Gregerson and I will welcome you. Our agenda will then move forward with school-related business. When the program is finished, all parents will go to their children's rooms. Junior high parents are invited to stay in the Church for a brief presentation from the junior high teachers.

As parents of students in grades K and grade 1 have already had a parent orientation night, they will not need to visit the classrooms. After the program in the Church, parents of grades 1 and K are welcome to check out the various groups who will set up displays in the cafeteria (Scouts, SCRIP, Cardinalfest, Girls on the Run, etc.). Parents who have a student in grades 7 or 8 will remain in the Church for a ten minute presentation from the junior high teachers. All teachers, grades 2-6, will open their classrooms for parent visitation. We will have three (10 minute) sessions of visitation with a five-minute passing period between the three sessions. Our resource teachers, and those who teach music, art, computers, physical education, and Spanish, will also be available for visits. Miss Svarczkopf, our librarian, will also be available in the library. The evening should be over by 8:45 p.m. Please realize you are all members of HASA, so we hope to see you there. To ensure that your child is in their classroom by 7:50 a.m. parents should be dropping off no later than 7:45 a.m. This is a parent responsibility as our students are not yet of driving age:) Please parents, do not cause stress for your children. Leave home in plenty of time to get to school. If you are currently cutting it close, I suggest beginning your entire morning routine 15 minutes earlier. The initial shock will soon become habit, and this will ensure that your children, and you, are not always in a stressful rush. Five tardy arrivals requires a student to serve an after-school detention. So please, be prepared, be calm, and be early!

BE A TEAM PLAYER - NO LEFT TURNS AFTER MORNING DROP OFF & AFTERNOON DISMISSAL

Doing so backs up traffic and creates some dangerous situations as people are gambling to pull out into heavy traffic. The cafeteria doors are open by 7:20 a.m., so you may want to drop off earlier to avoid the crush between 7:40-7:45 a.m. I thank everyone for your cooperation in dropping students off in the morning. As a drop off reminder, I do ask that students be prepared to get out of vehicles quickly when their turn comes to disembark. Parents, if students are having problems getting out of the car (upset, seat belt won't release, backpack problems, etc.) and the issue will take a while, please just pull into a parking spot so that you have the time you need and the line can keep flowing. 2016-2017 Library News

Welcome back! I am your school librarian, Ms. Svarczkopf writing to inform you of library happenings this school year! Please feel free to email, call, or stop in our library with any reading questions or concerns. I am here to encourage our children to learn by making reading exciting, rewarding, fulfilling, and **LASTING**.

Firstly, what a **wonderful summer reading program** we had! The school library was open on 8 occasions and students were rolling in! In fact, students **PASSED a total of 509 AR tests!** This absolutely CRUSHED the number of tests we took last summer (390). It is good to know so many students were reading over the summer months. J Names were drawn from those who passed AR tests, and gift cards were given over the summer. We also drew names for our **GRAND PRIZES** and those students are also listed below! Thank you to the parents who helped keep their children reading during the summer. It really does make a difference!

For those new to St. Charles, students in **grades 2-8** participate in the **Accelerated Reader** program as part of their reading grade. Your students will visit the library each week to check out books to read for AR. The AR program is simple to follow. **(1.)** The student reads a book from the Accelerated Reader book list. **(2.)** The student then takes a computerized test on the book (at **2016-2017 Library News (con't)** school only), answering multiple choice questions based on comprehension of the book's characters, plot, and summary. The students are NOT allowed to use the book to help them while taking a test. **(3.)** After finishing the test, the student receives a point score based on the number of questions answered correctly. For example, if the book was worth 5 points, and your child scored a 100% on the test, your child accumulated 5 points for the quarter by reading that book. **(4.)** Your child will continue this process until they have fulfilled OR surpassed their required point goal for that particular quarter. The computer keeps track of every student's points (quarterly & cumulatively), and the teachers then use the points for reading grades.

You can follow along with your student's AR progress at home. Sometime this week, a very important letter entitled "**Home Connect**" came home to you. Follow the set of instructions in the letter to create your account and begin monitoring your student right away! A list of all AR books is available for you to view by going to the following web address: www.arbookfind.com. There are countless books with AR tests for your student to choose from. Type in the title or author and you will be able to see if a book your student may want to read is actually an AR book. You will also be able to see the reading level and point value of the book. If you are not sure of a book is appropriate for your child to be reading, I recommend visiting www.commonensemedia.org.

The students have 20-30 minutes of library time each week. During this time they check out books, take Accelerated Reading tests, and learn library skills. I have lots of fun book talks, challenges, and projects in store this year. Students are permitted to check out two books (one book for kindergarten) at a time. They are to return the books after one week, or if they need, to renew it weekly. So, if books are not returned, students may not check out new ones. Please help your child find a safe place to keep books at home. (Out of reach of pets, little brothers or sisters, weather, food, etc.) If a student loses or damages a book, he/she must pay a proportionate fine or pay the cost of replacing the book. Please encourage your child to take care of books and to return borrowed materials to the library promptly. I want our students to look forward to coming to our library each week!
