SCHOOL SAFETY UPDATE

In our continued efforts to maintain safety in our schools, we have been providing lessons to students that involve a protocol for responding during an emergency situation. The instruction that students have been receiving has focused on options (Run, Hide, Fight) that students and teachers have in the event of an active shooter emergency. The Run, Hide, Fight protocol is recommended by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, the U.S. Department of Justice, the International Chiefs of Police, the Indiana State Police, and others. Run, Hide, Fight protocol has been modified for students based on age and will be presented in an age appropriate manner.

In addition to the Run, Hide, Fight protocol students are learning about the Standard Response Protocol (SRP). This is a national system of common vocabulary, which is used in the event of an emergency. The SRP is used in all schools in our Ft. Wayne – South Bend Diocese. A copy of the SRP is on the other side of this letter.

Preparing our students for real and present dangers is basic, fundamental education. Different times, different circumstances, and different dangers require that we prepare students in different ways. Nobody wants to contemplate something bad happening in our schools, but through responsible planning and training, we are able to respond to a crisis in order to better protect ourselves, and those around us.

Safer classrooms and work environments can only happen if we take action. Safety depends on our ability, our determination, and our commitment to make emergency preparedness a top priority. We encourage you to engage in discussions with your child about school and community safety in an effort to be prepared to act in the event of an emergency.

Over the past week, I have visited each classroom to discuss both SRP and Run, Hide, Fight. For our younger students, we discussed a bear in the building, and for the older students, I talked about an intruder in the building. This afternoon (Thursday), in conjunction with all Catholic schools in the Diocese, we conducted a lockdown drill with a mock door barricade. Over the course of the school year, we will continue to practice safety drills (fire, tornado, earthquake, lockdown, lockout, etc.) with our students.

Please talk to your children about our drills. Ask them what they have learned. Answer questions honestly and reassure any fears that may arise. We pray that we will never need to use our practice in a real situation, but we work to stay prepared to keep our people safe. On behalf of our Pastor, Father Tom Shoemaker, and our entire faculty and staff of St. Charles Borromeo School, I wish to invite you to our kindergarten registration day on Thursday, January 19th, from 1:15-2:30 p.m. in Rms C & D of the Hession Center.

Next school year, 2017-2018, children who will be five years old by August 1st are eligible for our kindergarten program.

Please note, our January 19th registration for kindergarten is early enough to ensure that parish families of St. Charles Borromeo have a first opportunity to register their children for kindergarten. During the first weeks of February, we will be opening enrollment for students who may qualify for the School Choice Scholarship, or voucher. In striving to provide the best possible educational opportunities for your child, the number of children in each of our four kindergarten classrooms will be kept at a maximum of 23 students. Each kindergarten teacher will also have the assistance of an instructional aide each day.

Please bring to registration:

1. A copy of your child's Social Security card, birth certificate and baptismal certificate.
2. We will also need a copy of your child's immunization record.
3. The registration fee is \$40.00 and is nonrefundable.

SCRIP NEWS

Winter is here! - In case there was any doubt, the calendar has officially declared that winter has arrived. We experienced a few school delays and cancelations before Christmas. So, we'd like to take this opportunity to remind you what weather delays do to the SCRIP schedule.

*2-Hour Delays

Mondays - The SCRIP staff will be in the office as soon as the weather permits. School orders will still be collected, filled and sent home at the end of the school day. We still welcome telephone orders. Walk in orders can be filled after we finish balancing - usually sometime after noon.

Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday - The SCRIP staff will be in as soon as the weather permits and is open until its normal time - noon.

Fridays - SCRIP sales that are normally held from 8-9 am in the Hession Center follow the school schedule. This means they are delayed 2 hours as well and take place from 10-11 am.

*School Closings

Mondays - SCRIP staff will open the office, if possible. Feel free to leave an order or message on the answering machine. Be sure to leave a phone number, we will fill the order and contact you when we make it into the office.

Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday - The SCRIP office will be open, weather permitting. You are welcome to leave an order or message on the answering machine.

Friday - SCRIP sales are cancelled. Depending on the severity of the weather, the SCRIP staff will attempt to make it in to the office to fill any phone orders. Be sure to leave a phone number, we will call you when your order is ready for pick-up.

Keep It Up - In totaling figures for the year, we saw that parish participation, once again, reached its highest level in December. We certainly understand why this happens and appreciate that we have orders from people who don't normally use SCRIP during the rest of the year.
