Grandparents/Special Persons Day

St. Charles' annual Special Person's Day is Tuesday, November 22. The students in 1st and 2nd grades have invited grandparents or other persons special in their lives to visit at school from 8:15 to approximately 10:30 that morning. ISTEP+ Update

As the media has been covering this past week, ISTEP+ scores have been officially released across our State of Indiana. Our scores are mediocre, at best, when looking at overall percentages. Although we made some gains over last year, we are not nearly where we hope to be. Our target is always 90% or above of all students passing. This is an ambitious goal, but that has been our target for the past 16 years. I am copying the scores of the nearby public schools as taken from the Journal Gazette to give you some comparison. As a school, we still are struggling to align with the test expectations since the test was changed two years ago. We are overdue for a new math program, and we may need to make adjustments at most, if not all, grade levels K-8. We will be visiting a few of the top scoring schools in the state to study best practices regarding curriculum, teacher instruction, and student learning. As a faculty and staff, we will continue to make progress. Thank you for your support as we navigate the needed changes. The chart below shows the percentage of students who passed the English language arts and math tests and those who passed both in grades 3 - 8. - Rob S.

Overall, though none of our teams advanced to regional competition, the coaches and team members were pleased with the effort, enthusiasm, and progress of all four teams. November Virtue - **Charity: Love of God & neighbor** (The Third Theological Virtue)

From **Charity**, usually represented by a heart, enables one to love as God Himself loves. By this virtue we love God above all things and are more concerned about our neighbor than we are about ourselves.

Charity is the theological virtue by which we love God above all things for his own sake, and our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God. Jesus makes charity the new commandment. Whence Jesus says: "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you; abide in my love." And again: "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you." Fruit of the Spirit and fullness of the Law, charity keeps the commandments of God and his Christ: "Abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love."	Joy, peace, and mercy are the fruits of charity. Charity is also manifested with outward actions. The chief of these external actions are kindness, almsgiving, and fraternal correction.

December Virtue - **Prudence** (The First Cardinal Virtue)

The word "cardinal" comes from the Latin word *cardo*, which means "hinge." The cardinal virtues are the principal moral virtues on which all the other virtues hinge.

From **Prudence**, usually represented by a scroll with a torch, gives us the ability to understand, with the very wisdom and light of Christ, what is the best thing to do at any time of life. When we read its scroll, we grow in our knowledge and understanding. Its torch enables us to see more deeply into confusing things to know the truth, and to know how to best act. Prudence enables one to reason and to act rightly in any given situation - 'right reason in action'. Prudence means making the best choices. Prudence means making wise and moral choices.

SGO APPLICATION FOR 2016-2017 – LAST CALL FOR \$500 TUITION SCHOLARSHIP
Parents, there is still time to apply for a \$500 SGO Scholarship if you qualify by income!
Many of our families have already applied and time is running out!

If your child receives an SGO scholarship at least one time, then your child can access a voucher in any following year that your income qualifies within the voucher income limits. Please look over the income chart below and check it against your adjusted gross income as listed on your 2015 tax returns. If you qualify within the limits of the SGO, please apply immediately and receive \$500 towards this year's tuition and a possible future voucher for 2017-2018!

As in previous years, the Scholarship Granting Organization of Northeast Indiana will be using FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment to verify family incomes for those wishing to apply for an SGO Scholarship. SGO Scholarships are not time sensitive unlike Choice Scholarships (vouchers); however, families are encouraged to fill out the FACTS **application forms by December 1, 2016** and to submit the required **income documents before December 16, 2016**.

Eligibility:

For a student to be eligible for an SGO Award, they must meet the following requirements:

- 1) Have legal settlement in Indiana
- 2) Be between the ages of 5 and 22 no later than August 1 of the school year.
- 3) Be accepted for enrollment into a participating Choice Scholarship school.
- 4) The student is a member of a household with an annual income equal to or below 200% of the amount to qualify for the Federal Free or Reduced Lunch Program can qualify for an SGO in the 2015-2016 school year.
 (Income limits for the 2016-2017 school year are listed below.)

Application Procedure:

1. Families will be required to submit an application through FACTS Grant & Aid either by filling out an online application at www.factstuitionaid.com or a paper application.
2. A copy of their 2015 Federal Income Tax Return as well as any supporting tax schedules and all 2015 W2s must also be uploaded, faxed, or mailed to FACTS Grant & Aid. (Please do not send in any state tax returns.)
3. A \$30 application fee is required that must be paid before a family can be verified with FACTS and considered for an SGO Award.

The procedure to apply for an SGO Award from the Scholarship Granting Organization of Northeast Indiana is the same as for applying for Large Family Fund, however the deadline to apply for the Large Family Fund was September 1, 2016. If a family has applied for Large Family Fund, they do not need to resubmit an application for the SGO.

Parents can put money into the student's account through your MealpayPlus online account at www.mealpayplus.com or by calling 877-237-0946 for a small fee. Or, you may send a check with the Lunch Accounting Form below to the school cafeteria. For example, if you have 3 children, send a check for \$90 payable to St. Charles Cafeteria and designate \$30 to each child's account. Each child who will eat hot lunch needs to have money in their account. It is recommended to have a minimum of \$12.50 in this account which will pay for five meals. If the student may want additional portions of the main entree, then it is recommended to have a minimum extra of \$6.25 in the account as well.
