Grandparents/Special Persons Day

St. Charles' annual Special Person's Day is Tuesday, November 21. The students in 1st and 2nd grades have invited grandparents or other persons special in their lives to visit at school from 8:15 to approximately 10:30 that morning. Our special guests are asked to park in the large church parking lot and may enter the school through door #3 (gym entrance) or door #9 (cafeteria entrance) and meet the children in the classroom by 8:00 am. The children will be walking from the classroom to church to attend the 8:15 am Mass with their guests. Following Mass, the special guests will have the opportunity to enjoy some coffee and donuts in the school cafeteria, while the children organize themselves in the classrooms. A specially prepared program will be held in the school gym for the guests which will conclude around 10:30 am. The students are looking forward to this special day to share with guests!

MEAL PAY PLUS & SCHOOL LUNCHES - Parents, we have been experiencing technical problems with Meal Pay Plus. If you have been trying to watch online the balance paid and due for your children's school lunches, you have probably discovered that there is a problem. In the last two months, the cafeteria has replaced their main computer, while saving the information from their old computer. Horizon Software is what is used on our computers to track payments and lunches purchased per student. Horizon Support is running behind and has not completed transferring data and communicating with our online Meal Pay Plus service. The cafeteria staff is awaiting this task to be completed. The point of service computer does not have the full Horizon software (which is located on the main computer), but our point of service computer does indicate student purchase and current balance. Unfortunately we cannot print your parent reports or statements and we are currently unable to communicate online with Meal Pay Plus. The cafeteria staff does respond to parent phone inquiries about lunch balances, or you may email them at cafeteria@stcharlesschoolfw.org. Finally, if you haven't sent payment in for awhile because the online account appears fine, the online account you see is probably incorrect. You may want to send in a payment next week. Thank you for your patience.

WINTER CHRISTMAS CONCERT - St. Charles School Fine Arts' students perform their annual Christmas Concert on **Thursday, November 30, at 7:00** pm in the Hession Center gym. This concert is free of charge for all and is a wonderful way to prepare for the sacred seasons of Advent and Christmas.. Students in the intermediate and advanced bands will perform several selections each. The hand chimes ensemble showcases a group of students who play individual chime tones creating beautiful music. The string orchestra is comprised of violin, viola and cello students who perform at the beginning, intermediate, and advanced levels. Young men and women who form the school choir will also perform several selections. Please plan on an hour of enjoyable entertainment and support the school fine arts' programs. 7:00pm marks the beginning, but there is no ending to the enjoyment you will experience! ARRIVAL & DISMISSAL REMINDERS - Thank you for your cooperation and patience during arrival and dismissal, we want traffic to flow smoothly and for everyone to stay safe. A few reminders to help us keep everyone safe and traffic flowing, car riders should be dropped off in the Big Lot and enter the cafeteria, not at the office nor in the corner lot. Cars should only turn right onto Trier Rd. after dropping off students outside the cafeteria. Cars turning left onto Reed tends to back things up especially during rainy weather when more students are dropped off around the church. During dismissal, students should be picked up in their parking spots or lateline. Do not pick up your children outside Door #15. If children are walking home, they should walk home, not be walking to a car parked across the street. We do not want students getting into cars near moving traffic. The Holiday Season – With Thanksgiving on our doorstep, Christmas is not far behind. A little planning ahead and taking advantage of SCRIP as your gift card headquarters, is a great way to streamline your holiday shopping so you can concentrate on the true meaning of the season. Order Form Basics – Filling out your order form carefully and completely is always important, but with the extra volume of holiday orders, it's appreciated more than ever.

- Remember that the name is **YOUR name**, not your student's name. Knowing your envelope number helps us confirm your identity even more.
- Please be sure to enter your student's name and room number so we know where to send your filled order.
- Take extra care when filling in each desired item – filling in the number of cards and extending it to the total amount. *i.e. Meijer...under the \$25 column – 2, under the \$100 column – 1 under the total column – \$150*
- Filling in the order totals on the front and back of the order form helps us to be sure that we have not forgotten anything on your order.
- Remember to check out all the available merchants that Great Lakes offers. These can be ordered on Monday and available by Thursday. We for you to place your order by than **9 am** on each **Monday** – *even when there is a 2-hour delay.*

Parents can put money into the student's account through your MealpayPlus online account at www.mealpayplus.com or by calling 866-662-3382 for a small fee. Or, you may send a check with the Lunch Accounting Form below to the school cafeteria. For example, if you have 3 children, send a check for \$90 payable to St. Charles Cafeteria and designate \$30 to each child's account. Each child who will eat hot lunch needs to have money in their meal account. It is recommended to have a minimum of \$13.00 in this account which will pay for five meals. If the student may want additional portions of the main entrée, then it is recommended to have a minimum of \$6.00 in the general account as well. If you have questions regarding this, you may call the school cafeteria at 969-4028 on school days 8:00-12:30 or the school office at 484-3392.
