HASA/BACK-TO-SCHOOL NIGHT, MONDAY, AUG. 19th, 7:00 PM IN CHURCH! ALL PARENTS SHOULD ATTEND!

Our HASA/Back-to-School Night will be held in the Church again this year. This is a night for parents. We ask that, if possible, the children not attend, as this is more of an informational format geared towards adults/parents. I realize that leaving the children at home may not be possible for some families, in which case, of course you are welcome to bring the little ones. At 7:00 p.m., all parents are asked to come to the Church where Father Shoemaker and I will welcome you. Our agenda will then move forward with school-related business. When the program is finished, all parents will go to their children's rooms. Junior high parents are invited to stay in the Church for a brief presentation from the junior high teachers.

As parents of students in grades Pre-K, K and 1 have already had a parent orientation night, they will not need to visit the classrooms after the program. After the program in the Church, parents of grades 1, K, and Pre-K are welcome to check out the various groups who have displays in the cafeteria (Scouts, SCRIP, CardinalFest, Girls on the Run, etc.). All teachers, grades 2-8, will open their classrooms for parent visitation. We will have three (10 minute) sessions of visitation with a five-minute passing period between the three sessions. Our resource teachers, and those who teach music, art, computers, physical education, and Spanish, will also be available for visits. Mrs. Knox, our librarian, will also be available in the library. Mrs. McGraw, our tech coordinator will be available in her office near the cafeteria. The evening should be over by 8:45 p.m. Please realize you are all members of HASA, so we hope to see you there. IMPORTANT 2019-2020 Library News

Welcome back! I'm writing to inform you of library happenings this school year! Please feel free to email, call, or stop in our library with any reading questions or concerns.

What a spectacular turnout at the library this summer! I was happy to see so many eager readers join us for our eight open library sessions. Many students took advantage of an early start to their 1st quarter reading goals by taking Accelerated Reader (AR) tests and accumulating points. Thank you to the parents and guardians who continued to keep reading alive in your homes even during the busy summer months! After each of the eight library sessions, one special test taker was chosen from a hat and awarded a \$10 gift certificate. There was also one GRAND PRIZE WINNER for the entire summer!

Here are the winners: Tyler Rodenbeck: \$10 to DeBrand, Gregory Hpungmaw: \$10 to McDonald's, Caitlin O'Rourke: \$10 to Starbucks, Claire Woenker: \$10 to Cookie Cottage, Annabelle Sweigert: \$10 to Culver's, Ava Schortgen: \$10 to DQ, Charlotte Pfeiffer: \$10 to Zesto, and DJ Gleason: \$10 to Chipotle. Finally, the student with the most AR points accumulated this summer received the GRAND PRIZE: \$20 to Target! Congratulations, Natalee Ade, you accumulated **294.2 points** this summer! **GOOD FOR YOU!**

The students have 20-30 minutes of time each week at the school library. During this time students check out books, take Accelerated Reading tests, and learn about literature. Students are permitted to check out two books (one book for pre-k & kindergarten) at a time. Students are to return the books after one week, or if needed, the book may be renewed weekly. If books are not returned, students may not check out new ones. Please help your child find a safe place to keep books at home. (Out of reach of pets, little brothers or sisters, weather, food, etc.) If a student loses or damages a book, s/he must pay a proportionate fine or pay the cost of replacing the book. Please encourage your child to take care of books and to return borrowed materials to the library promptly. I am looking forward to library time with your students each week!



For those new to St. Charles, students in **grades 2-8** participate in the **Accelerated Reader (AR) program as part of their reading grade**. Students will visit the library each week to check out books to read for AR. The AR program is simple to follow. **(1.)** The student reads a book from the Accelerated Reader book list. **(2.)** The student takes a computerized test on the book (at school only), answering multiple choice questions based on comprehension of the book's characters, plot, and summary. The students are NOT allowed to use the book to help them while taking a test. **(3.)** After finishing the test, the student receives a point score based on the number of questions answered correctly. For example, if the book was worth 5 points, and the student scored a 100% on the test, s/he accumulated 5 points for the quarter by reading that book. **(4.)** Students continue this process until they have fulfilled OR surpassed the required point goal for that particular quarter. The computer keeps track of every student's points (quarterly & cumulatively), and the teachers then include the points for students' reading grades.

Parents can follow along with student's AR progress at home through our AR HOME CONNECT program. This week, a very important letter entitled "Home Connect" was given to the students to give to parents. Follow the set of instructions in the letter to create your parent account and begin monitoring your student right away! A list of all AR books is available for parents to view by going to the following web address: www.arbookfind.com. There are countless books with AR tests from which students may choose. Type in the title or author and you will be able to see if a book your student may want to read is actually an AR book. You will also be able to see the reading level and point value of the book. If you are not sure of a book is appropriate for your child to be reading, I recommend visiting www.commonsemmedia.org.

The AR points listed in this chart represent the number of points required to be earned each grading period by the students. This is included in the students' reading or literature quarter grades on report cards. Grades 1 & 2 only test with teacher's discretion.

We hope everyone had a good first week of school, we certainly did. It was nice to see orders from families that we have missed all summer. We look forward to meeting lots of you, new and old, and answering questions at the ***Back-to-School night on Monday, August 19.***

Back-to-School SCRIP Giveaways – ***All ***Pre-K, Kindergarten*** and ***First Grade*** families should have received an information packet from **SCRIP**. It contained a welcome letter, information about several aspects of **SCRIP** and a special order form. That special order form is your entry for a chance to win ***"FREE SCRIP!"*** It's our way of welcoming you to a new school year as well as **SCRIP**. All you have to do is place a ***SCRIP order*** using that special order form. ***The deadline for placing an order to qualify for the giveaway is Monday, August 19.***

Monday evening we will have different "special order forms" for school families. Orders placed on these special order forms will automatically enter you into a drawing for another chance for ***"FREE SCRIP!" We will be in the cafeteria after the all school meeting to answer questions and to pass out the special order forms. ***The deadline for placing a qualifying order in this giveaway is Thursday, August 29.***

\$scrip Credit – Credits earned by **SCRIP** customers from January through May, 2019 have been ready since the end of June. If you have not received your credit statement yet, it is coming home with one of your school students today, Friday, August 16.

Remember these credit statements are the same as cash, so please use it as soon as possible or put it in a safe place until you are ready to use it. ***Remember to sign the statement and mark how you want to use your credits*** before turning it in.

Schedule Reminder – we want to remind you of a few schedule policies:

- When there is no school on Friday, **SCRIP** sales take place on Thursday. This will happen for the first time this school year on ***Thursday, August 29;*** there is ***no school on Friday, August 30.***

- While it is too early for snow, fog can be an issue at any time of year and cause a school delay. St. Charles makes their own decision for calling these delays. If a delay happens on a **SCRIP** sale day, the sales follow the delay as well.
- **There are no SCRIP sales Labor Day weekend – Friday Aug. 30 – Sunday Sept. 1**

Statement of Bishop Kevin C. Rhoades on Gun Violence 8-14-19

The terrible plague of deadly mass shootings in our country calls us, in the words of the U.S. bishops, “to fight this social disease that has infected our nation.” I join my voice to my brother bishops’ in inviting all to pray and work to end this culture of violence and to advocate for needed changes to prevent this scourge from continuing.

The proliferation of mass shootings can be called an epidemic against life. When mass shootings occur, there is extensive coverage by the media. However, we need to bring attention to the fact that murderous gun violence also takes place on a daily basis throughout our nation in individual shootings, which total, on average, over 100 people each day in homes and on the streets. Gun violence is truly a national epidemic.

Some citizens consider the right to bear arms, enshrined in our Second Amendment, an absolute right. Nowhere in Church teaching do we find an inherent natural right to bear arms. The legitimate use of arms, however, could be seen to fall under the Church’s teaching on self-defense. People can choose to own and use guns or not to own and use guns, presuming, of course, that their use would be legitimate (e.g. hunting or self-protection).

Besides the principle of self-defense, it is important to recognize the right to life of the human person and the principle of the common good. As a people of and for life, we cannot remain idle as the right to life is violated on a daily basis. We must not be indifferent when the common good is threatened. In the light of the right to life and the common good, both rooted in the Gospel of Jesus, we must confront the plague of gun violence in our nation.

Common sense reforms and prudent policies are needed to curb gun violence. I join my brother bishops in rejecting an absolutist interpretation of the Second Amendment. For the sake of the common good, we need reasonable gun control, beginning with comprehensive background checks and a ban on high-powered, high-capacity weapons meant for the military.

At the same time, we cannot and should not ignore the root causes of gun violence. We need prevention and intervention strategies that treat people who pose a threat of violence. Increased access to mental health care is necessary. We need to fight hatred, racism and xenophobia, which so often can lead to violence. We also cannot ignore the moral and spiritual vacuum in which many children and youth are raised — homes where there is abuse and neglect, alcoholism and drug addiction. And we must address the crisis of fatherlessness.

Tragically, we live in a culture that doesn’t value life intrinsically, as seen in the recognition of so-called rights to abortion, euthanasia and physician-assisted suicide. Should we really be surprised that when life is not valued in these situations, life is not valued in instances of gun violence? Should we really be surprised at the prevalence of gun violence when violence is celebrated in much of our media, music and even video games? The glorification of violence reveals a disturbing cultural attitude.

We are called to build a culture of life and a civilization of love. Easy access to deadly assault weapons does not build a culture of life. Regulating and controlling guns is part of building a culture of life — so is our teaching on human life and dignity, on marriage and family, on right and wrong, on justice and peace, and on rights and responsibilities.

Finally, there is a spiritual dimension to the crisis of violence that we must attend to. Seeds of violence within the human heart can grow into violent thoughts, words and deeds. We need to ask God to purify our hearts and to convert the hearts of those who are tempted to commit acts of violence.

I invite all to pray for an end to gun violence and to pray for peace in our hearts, communities, nation and world. Let us hear anew the words of Jesus: “Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God.”
