**HAPPY LABOR DAY EVERYONE!** As **Matthew 11:28-30** shows us, **even the Lord wants us to rest!** Jesus said, **"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light."**

**Labor Day 2019** - On September 2, 2019, the U.S. Department of Labor celebrates and honors the greatest worker in the world – the American worker. Labor Day 2019 is the 125th anniversary of Labor Day being celebrated as a national holiday.

**Labor Day: What it Means** - Labor Day, the first Monday in September, is a creation of the labor movement and is dedicated to the social and economic achievements of American workers. It constitutes a yearly national tribute to the contributions workers have made to the strength, prosperity, and well-being of our country.

**Labor Day Legislation** - The first governmental recognition came through municipal ordinances passed in 1885 and 1886. From these, a movement developed to secure state legislation. The first state bill was introduced into the New York legislature, but the first to become law was passed by Oregon on February 21, 1887. During 1887, four more states – Colorado, Massachusetts, New Jersey, and New York – created the Labor Day holiday by legislative enactment. By the end of the decade Connecticut, Nebraska, and Pennsylvania had followed suit. By 1894, 23 more states had adopted the holiday, and on June 28, 1894, Congress passed an act making the first Monday in September of each year a legal holiday in the District of Columbia and the territories.

## SCRIP NEWS



We hope that many of you will have time this weekend to relax and enjoy some time off as our nation celebrates our work force. Not everyone will be lucky enough to have the weekend off, so Keep them in your prayers and be extra nice to the people who are working this weekend.

There are **NO SCRIP sales this weekend**, and the **SCRIP office will be closed on Monday**. We will be back in the office on Tuesday; school orders will be collected and filled on Tuesday.

**Party Time!** – Next weekend is our annual **Cardinal Fest**. **SCRIP sales will** take place at their regular times – after the 5 pm Mass on Saturday and on Sunday from 8:30 – 11 am. You can help with the celebration by donating a gift card or two to be used for prizes. Look for the special pink order form – you get the SCRIP credit and the gift cards are delivered directly to the Cardinal Fest committee.

Currently, **Fazoli's** is a **\$25** card with a 14% rebate. This was one of Great Lakes back-to-school bonuses. We recently added **Mike's Works** cards at **\$16** with a 22% rebate. We have a few other items that are in short supply after acquiring inventory from a SCRIP program that was closing. When in doubt, wait to write your check until you are certain the items you ordered are available. Our goal is to offer the most popular items at their highest rebate.

Or, you may send a check with the Lunch Accounting Form below to the school cafeteria. For example, if you have 3 children, send a check for \$90 payable to St. Charles Cafeteria and designate \$30 to each child's account. Each child who will eat hot lunch needs to have money in their meal account. It is recommended to have a minimum of \$14.00 in this account which will pay for five meals. If the student may want additional portions of the main entree, then it is recommended to have a minimum of \$6.00 in the account as well.
